New Early Head Start Center Opens at Meadowbrook Apartments

Research shows that small children who are enrolled in programs that introduce them to subjects like music, language, math and science are more likely to stay in school, go to college, and get good jobs when they become adults.

HACA, Child Inc., and Mainspring Schools recently opened new Early Head Start Center in a former Meadowbrook community building to provide full-day, year-round services to Head Start eligible infants, toddlers and their families in the south Austin neighborhood.

"We value our partnership with HACA and Mainspring," said Child Inc. Executive Director Albert L. Black. "These partnerships enable us to spend much-needed time with each child for early education and social and emotional growth, because if we don't spend time with our children ... the system will."

Mainspring has hired new teaching staff, an Early Head Start program director, and enrolled six existing teachers in

The new 3,025-square-foot Early Head Start Center at Meadowbrook houses two infant classrooms, staff offices, and a parent breastfeeding room and lounge. Early Head Start toddlers will be served in classrooms at Mainspring's main building on West Live Oak.

Apply Now for Free Minds 2017

If you're an adult who wants to go to college, let Free Minds help you reach your educational goals! Applications for the Free Minds class of 2017 are due July 1. Classes take place two evenings a week over two semesters. Tuition, books, child care and support services are free. University of Texas and Austin Community College (ACC) professors teach literature, philosophy, history and writing. Students who finish the course earn six credit hours from ACC. You are eligible if you: are at least 18 years old; have a high school diploma or GED; don't have a college degree and haven't been enrolled in a degree program in the past two years; have demonstrated financial need; can read challenging books in English; and can attend class regularly and complete all assignments.
