HACA is committed to **helping the residents** of its public housing communities, its Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher holders, and other qualified **low-income persons** residing in the Austin-Round Rock-San Marcos Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA), achieve their goals of **self-sufficiency**. To achieve this, HACA, its staff, contractors and subcontractors will comply with the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968.

Section 3 requires that, to the greatest extent feasible, **training, employment and other economic opportunities** generated by HUD funds be directed to low-income residents, particularly those who are recipients of government assistance for housing, and to **award contracts** to eligible businesses that provide economic opportunities for these persons.

Section 3 promotes **self-sufficiency** by making available **job training**, **employment and contracting opportunities**. By providing this foundation together with other community resources, the opportunities for economic advancement and self-sufficiency are increased.

Who are Section 3 Residents?

A section 3 resident is —

- 1) a public housing resident; or
- 2) A low income person residing in the Austin-Round Rock-San Marcos MSA (includes Bastrop County, Caldwell County, Hays County, Travis County, Williamson County).

What is a Section 3 Business Concern?

Section 3 Business Concerns are businesses that meet one of the following:

- A) 51% or more owned by Section 3 residents; or
- B) At least 30% of its full time employees are Section 3 residents, or were Section 3 residents within three years of the date of first hire; or
- C) Provide a commitment to subcontract to Section 3 business concerns, 25% or more of the dollar amount of the awarded contract.

HACA's Responsibilities

Pursuant to Section 3:

- Implementing procedures to notify Section 3 residents and business concerns about training, employment and contracting opportunities generated by Section 3 covered assistance;
- ✓ Notifying potential contractors working on Section 3 covered contracts of their responsibilities;
- ✓ Incorporating the Section 3 clause into all covered requests and contracts;
- Facilitating the training and employment of Section 3 residents and the award of contracts to Section 3 business concerns;
- Assisting and actively cooperating with the Secretary of HUD in making contractors and subcontractors comply;
- Refraining from entering into contracts with contractors that are in violation of Section 3 regulations;
- ✓ Documenting actions taken to comply with Section 3; and
- ✓ Submitting Section 3 Annual Summary Reports.



What is Section 3 covered assistance?

Section 3 applies to the following HUD assistance (section 3 covered assistance) from Public and Indian housing assistance (PIH) for:

- I. Operations
- 2. Modernization
- 3. Development

What is a Section 3 covered contract?

A Section 3 covered contract is a contract or subcontract, including a professional service contract, awarded by HACA for work generated by HUD funds listed above: Examples of Section 3 covered contracts:

 \Rightarrow Abatement \Rightarrow Engineering \Rightarrow Make Ready \Rightarrow Pest Control \Rightarrow Architect \Rightarrow Landscaping \Rightarrow Painting \Rightarrow Tree Trimming


*Section 3 covered contract does not include contracts for the purchase of goods ONLY.

When is Section 3 triggered?

Section 3 requirements are triggered when <u>new</u> jobs and/or contracting opportunities are created during the completion of covered contracts. Section 3 residents and business concerns are not guaranteed employment or contracting opportunities. They must demonstrate that they meet the qualifications for new employment and/or contracting opportunities.

What responsibilities do HACA departments have of Section 3 compliance?

The S3 Coordinator is at the center of S3 compliance at HACA.



Section 3 HACA Goals

Employment

◆ 30% of the total number of <u>new hires</u> shall be Section 3 residents.

Contracting

- ◆ 10% of all Section 3 covered construction contracts shall be awarded to Section 3 business concerns; and
- ◆ 3% of the total dollar amount of all non-construction contracts shall be awarded to Section 3 business concerns.
