VOICE YOUR OPINION ON HOUSING CHALLENGES IN THE AUSTIN AREA

What is your housing story? What challenges do you face in finding the housing you need? Can your family find quality schools and employment? Do you think you have experienced housing discrimination? Take the regional Analysis of Impediments survey to help Central Texas cities, counties and housing authorities learn more about why you live where you live and what housing challenges you face.

The City of Austin, Travis County, Williamson County, Pflugerville, Round Rock, and area housing authorities are collaborating on this regional housing and economic opportunity study to identify meaningful actions to overcome historic patterns of segregation, promote fair housing choice, and foster inclusive communities free from discrimination.



The goal of The Central Texas Fair Housing Assessment is to help communities like Austin improve economic conditions for all residents, in a way that best fits the community.

In 2016, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban

Development (HUD) launched a new approach to identifying fair housing challenges in a city and region, called the Assessment of Fair Housing. This

This survey will inform the decision about whether Central Texas receives federal housing and community development funds from HUD. This requirement originates from the Fair Housing Act of 1968, which mandates that HUD administer programs and activities relating to housing and urban development in a manner that affirmatively furthers the policies of the Act.

- Please consider that posters will need to be packaged, mailed and reproduced.

- All contestants must sign a release making their entry the property of HACA and NAHRO and permitting duplication/publication. The release should be secured to the back of the entry.
- All contestants must provide a short narrative on the inspiration, vision and importance of their poster design. The narrative should be secured on the back of the entry.
- Contestants' name, grade level and housing authority must be written on the back of each poster entry.
- Posters will not be returned.
